## **Proposed Diversion of Public Footpath FWO 89 at Woolaston Grange, Parish of Woolaston**

Please find enclosed a plan showing the proposed diversion of part of public footpath FWO 89 at Woolaston Grange in the parish of Woolaston. The application has been made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 and is in the interest of the landowner.

The proposed diversion is illustrated on the attached plan, which shows part of public footpath FWO 89 marked BC (shown by a continuous bold line) to be moved to a route marked BDE (shown by a bold broken line). The footpath will remain as current between points A and B.

The footpath currently runs through the property The Glen, 47 Woolaston Grange. The line of the path runs through the house itself with walkers currently using a route through the property's garden. The purpose of the diversion is to move walkers away from the residential dwelling and garden area at The Glen. The proposed new route is a more open and pleasant alternative for walkers, as well as providing a more direct link to public footpath FWO/90.

There is an existing stile at Point B which would remain. At Point D there is a pre-existing accommodation bridge to provide access over the stream. At Point E the existing field gate will be replaced with a 2 in 1 field gate compliant to British Standard 5709: 2006.
